I. Opening Time – 7:05 PM PST

I. Officer Reports

II. Chapter Reports

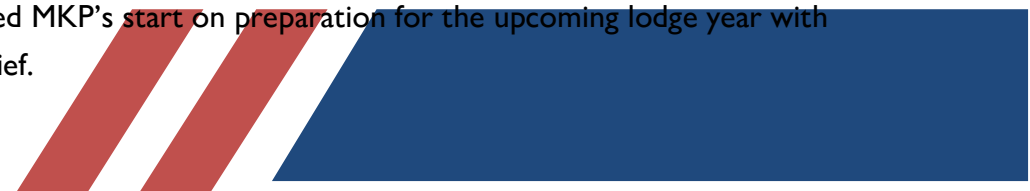
II. Ashuk T'salil – Kashvi plans for Ashuk T'salil's next chapter meeting to be held the week following the LEC.

XIII. Conclave (7:10-7:32)

- A) General information: Conclave will be hosted from September 18-20 at Camp Parsons, and the Lodge Chief expressed his desire for T'Kope Kwiskwis to have as MANY people as possible present given that we're the host lodge. To promote progress toward this goal, he requested for representatives present at the LEC to email their chapters to promote the event and accessibility to its related resources.
 - i) According to John R's available data, both Nisqually and Sikhs Mox Lamonti lodges are outnumbering us in registration counts.
 - ii) Strong suggestion made by Lodge Chief on registering now and taking initiative in doing so early. As we desire to have the most scouts present out of the lodges in the section, John R emphasized our goal to get at least 300 scouts.
 - iii) Lisa C reminded the LEC of an exclusive Conclave patch offered to T'Kope members who serve as staff. While no designated staff sign-up is available as of the date of the LEC, John R
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detailed general jobs that will be available from food attendants, lifeguards, parking, restroom maintenance, etc.

- B) Registration: Currently \$75. Inquiry from Treasurer directed toward the Section Chief confirmed that there is no set registration deadline, but that on-site signups day-of the event will be marked at an unknown yet increased price.
 - i) New Arrowmen (inducted anytime after Sept. 2025) get a \$10 discount, and the importance of engaging them soon after their Ordeal is stressed from a perspective of retention.
 - C) Ethan H of the Brotherhood Committee inquired about any potential plan to host a Brotherhood ceremony at Conclave. Nick K and John R alluded to the skeleton of an underdeveloped plan and each pledged to follow up with any responsible parties.
 - D) Lodge Adviser John S reminded the LEC that only members 21 and under can vote for those running for section positions (and must be under 20 day-of the event if running for a section position, as one must remain under 21 through tenure).
 - i) Nick K overviewed the eligibility requirements to run for Section Chief, including a letter or an email endorsement from the Scout Executive.
 - E) John R reminded the LEC that Conclave will host an auction with donations being open and appreciated.
 - F) The suggestion for chapters to offer carpools was acknowledged but referenced as part of the logistics individual chapters are responsible for.
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XIV. Section Inductions Experience (7:33 – 7:38)

- A) General information: Torin B provided context for the Sections Inductions Experience (SIE), which will be hosted at Camp Sheppard from October 23-25. John R is building a registration signup with Josh C which will be sent to Lodge leadership in all G15 lodges. First come first serve registration. There is a total of 80 spots for participants to be divided up by the lodges in the section, deprioritizing T'Kope, as we're the exemplar lodge with attendees at the National Inductions Experience (NIE). In place of an open signup, each lodge will only be sent the slots available to them so that they can select their own preferred representatives to learn the new Ordeal structure.
- B) Staffing: As the exemplar lodge of Section G15, it's T'Kope Kwiskwis's responsibility to host the event. The ceremonies team will begin training to familiarize themselves with the new material the day after the LEC (9/3/2026). Attendees of the NIE will be emailed by Spencer M if they haven't been already to inquire about their availability to serve as Luminaries or another role at the SIE. Luminaries will need to take three evening classes, amounting to six hours of training in advance.
 - i) The health officer, kitchen staff, and administration staff will be planned separately by the section and other parties involved.
- C) The Treasurer asked Torin B about any existing plans to run the trading post at the SIE. Torin responded by stating it wasn't yet point of discussion but that he'd confirm later in a meeting with John R.

XV. Fall Rally (7:39-7:42)

- A) Vice Chief of Service Ben G expressed his desire for it to be noted that the Fall Rally would occur on the first weekend of October (2-4).
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- B) Nick K inquired about Vice Chief of Service Brianna R's Fall Rally plans in terms of activities to be hosted there. Brianna asked Secretary Karn N to update the lodge website to include correct registration for the event, to which the Secretary confirmed his plans to familiarize himself with the website's maintenance with assistance from Nick K and/or Noah C. Nick noted that the existing Fall Rally registration on Blackpug currently had no listed price despite being open and needed to be fixed. Despite this glitch, appropriate payment is expected even for those currently registered under no price.
 - C) Training: Vice Chief of Inductions Aurora H reminded the LEC that Inductions training will be hosted at Fall Rally, and that even for those who've completed it prior, the training must be renewed every year. Treasurer Ian S inquired about any additional training being done during the event. In addition to Inductions training, Elections training for unit election assistance and Niemat training for future Brotherhood ceremonies will be held.
 - D) Ethan H of the Brotherhood Committee informed the LEC of his efforts in establishing the Brotherhood signup and related email notifications prepared in advance of Fall Rally.

New Business / Open Forum (7:42-7:48)

XVI. Lodge Chief Nick Krum – Temporary hold on lodge events

Nick K announced that the lack of an up-to-date complete safety plan resulted in a temporary hold on events the lodge can host and requested of the LEC to plan as if nothing is changing. All outdoor activity with OA organized by the lodge is postponed, with the exemption of Conclave remaining unaffected.

- i) Ian S asked if this information should be withheld or given to chapters, with Josh C confirming it can be shared with chapters if desired.
- ii) In a follow up, Ian asked about any potential reimbursement for Silver Marmot Pass holders, to which Torin B confirmed that the issue would be discussed at the subsequent LOM should it become prevalent, an improbable scenario.

XVII. Vice Chief of Service Ben Goett – Group communications app

Ben G suggested that the lodge adopt usage of a group communications app such as Band, GroupMe, Slack, or an alternative for the use of efficient communication among Arrowmen.



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- i) The Lodge Chief requested a written proposal from Ben to flesh out the pros and cons of the suggestion, to ready by the next LEC. In agreement, Ben promised for a draft to be ready by the September LOM with a full discussion to be hosted at the November LEC.

XVIII. Hyiu Chuck Adviser Matt Hamel – Positions update

Matt H requested for the Secretary to update the lodge website to display the correct and up-to-date names and contact information for each listed lodge and individual chapter position.
